2010 – The Year at a Glance

THE NUMBERS ARE IN...

- We awarded 1.3 million dollars in financial assistance to children and families thanks to our generous donors.
- Through the Strong Kids Financial Assistance Program...
 - 49 Kids experienced Y Arts Academy
 - 43 Hiked at Camp Wakonda
 - 1,362 Children received assistance for Prime Time Child Care
 - 161 Tumbled in Gymnastics
 - 847 Participated in Youth Sports
 - 3,267 Received a YMCA membership
- We awarded \$74,548 in free memberships to foster families through our Foster Family Assistance Program.
- We awarded \$23,381 in free memberships to area military families with a parent deployed out of the country.
- Our Child Care Program serves over 6,000 children at 45 different schools and 8 YMCA facilities throughout Springfield and the surrounding communities.



STRATEGIC PLAN

Premise of Planning Model:

Our organization is in a dynamic period of our history. We have expanded our impact within our region and have significant pending projects. This combined with limited resources has created the necessity of specific focus in select areas. Essentially, we have in front of us significant initiatives that should be our focus during a period of time where defining what is normal is unclear.

This does not mean we ignore other areas of our operation. Management of operating issues will still be the focus of staff. For example, cleanliness and program development are still important issues that we will continue to attempt to improve. Those areas are not recommended to be part of the total association objectives.

Key areas of focus for branches that achieve our promise for Youth Development, Healthy Living, and Social Responsibility:

• FACILITY IMPROVEMENTS AND UPKEEP.

Continue to provide and enhance our facilities, with up-to-date facilities, equipment, unquestionable cleanliness, and suitable space.

• CONTINUED FOCUS ON YOUTH AND FAMILIES.

Continue to and enhance our ability to serve youth and families. This represents the core of our purpose and strengthens our impact in the region.

• CONTINUED REFINEMENT OF CHRISTIAN PURPOSE.

This sets the YMCA apart from any other provided of our services and we need to continue to reflect the culture of our communities while begin open to all.

• IMPROVEMENT ON SUCCESS OF HEALTH SEEKERS.

Our organization is committed to serving health seekers. Some of our branches have limited success in serving. We know Health Seekers represent 60 to 65% of our membership. Retaining these members is the key to growing our membership.

• RENEWED COMMITMENT TO STRONG KIDS.

We have had good success in the development of our strong kid's annual campaign. We also have come nowhere close to reaching our potential. Branches that have committed themselves have shown tremendous increase. Consideration should be given to closing the gap of what we give away and what we raise through the annual campaign.

• STRENGTHEN KEY COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS AND LEADERSHIP IN COMMUNITY.

The Y has meaningful relationships in our communities that are vital to our impact on the community. It is vital that we deliberately strengthen and seek out relationships that will strengthen our cause. Our Y's to provide leadership to our community initiatives that support the association objectives.

2003 Tri-Lakes expands. Ward Branch renovated.

2006 On July 24, Roy Blunt YMCA of Bolivar began construction on their new facility.

2007 Springfield Family YMCA changes its name to Ozarks Regional YMCA to better reflect the entire association. Roy Blunt YMCA opens a satellite facility in Cassville.

2008 Dallas County Area YMCA opens a service facility.

2009 Feasibility Study conducted in June to begin process of bringing a YMCA to the Lebanon Community.

2010 Lebanon Family YMCA opens January 4.

2011 Pat Jones YMCA Aquatics Center Opens with New Family Pool. Bolivar Aquatics Center Breaks Ground.

HEALTHY LIVING: Improving the nation's health and well-being.

SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY: Giving back and providing support to our neighbors.

OPPORTUNITIES FOR ALL

The Y is for everyone. Our programs, services and initiatives: enable kids to realize their potential, prepare teens for college, offer ways for families to have fun together, empower people to be healthier in spirit, mind and body, prepare people for employment, welcome and embrace newcomers and help foster a nationwide service ethic. And that's just the beginning.

The Ozarks Regional YMCA is not-for-profit organization that believes no one should be denied access to membership and programs due to the inability to pay. In 2010, Ozarks Regional YMCA provided over \$1.3 in financial assistance. These funds are subsidized through the United Way of the Ozarks and through the annual Strong Kids Financial Assistance Program.

YOUTH DEVELOPMENT

- Barracuda Swim Team: Our swim team doubled in size and a parent advisory committee was formed to provide support for the team. The swim team participated in monthly meets and travelled to the Seymour, Carthage and Lebanon YMCAs and the Chesterfield Family Center.
- Youth swim lessons grew by 38%
- 1st Annual Indoor Kidathlon was held as a part of our Healthy Kids Day. Youth had the opportunity to participate in a diaper dash, tot trot or kidathlon.
- We continued our work with the Childhood Obesity Action Group to address the needs of youth in our community. Through our work with the Childhood Obesity Action Group, the Y serves as the fiscal agent for a Walking School Bus (WSB) grant, which will allow four elementary schools to implement the WSB program.
- The Girls on the Run Program grew by 20% serving 216 girls. Over 400 girls and volunteers participated in two 5K runs in their culminating events. The Girls on the Run program focuses on building self-esteem and improving physical and emotional well-being. The Girls on the Run Program also received a \$5,000 grant from the Junior League of Springfield to help expand their program into more schools.

HEALTHY LIVING

- To provide wellness of spirit, mind and body to our community, we collaborated with 58 companies and organizations to promote wellness for their employees and participants through our corporate membership program, on-site wellness classes and through use of our indoor rock climbing wall.
- Our 3rd Annual Indoor Triathlon had 21% growth and provided community members with the opportunity to take part in a fun and healthy event.
- To improve the health of our community we collaborated with Jordan Valley Health Center to develop workshops and classes to serve those individuals who are diabetic or pre-diabetic.

SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

- Healthy Living Alliance: The Y will be serving as the lead agent for an exciting new collaboration. The Y and the Healthy Living Alliance was one of seven Missouri nonprofits selected by the Missouri Foundation for Health (MFH) to receive matching grant funds through the Social Innovation

Fund, a program of the Corporation for National and Community Service. The idea is to use partnerships to create sustainable wellness programs in low-income venues of the Springfield Metropolitan area focusing on physical activity, nutrition, tobacco-free policy implementation and health care. This pilot program will begin with schools and work sites in an effort to refine a method of replication before moving into other community venues like neighborhoods and childcare programs.

- To continue to be a good neighbor for the residents and patrons of the Downtown area, by collaborating with First Night activities on New Year's Eve and with First Friday Art Walk by offering Family Art Night each month. The community continues to see the YMCA as a valued partner as evident by the 20% increase in Family Art Night participants.
- Annual Auction Event- New Special Event Committee was formed to create our Divas and Denim event which rose over \$40,000 for our financial assistance program.

CHILD CARE

- 1,800 kids served each day at 34 different schools throughout Springfield.
- Provided over \$200,000 in financial assistance to Springfield youth and families so that kids could attend the before and after school child care program (Prime Time).
- Completed a 3 year grant cycle with Missouri Foundation of Health that enabled us to develop, implement and sustain model practices for our before and after school child care program. The end result of this collaboration is a re-vitalized program that is focused on enriching the lives of kids and families that we serve.
- In October our Boo Bash was celebrated with over 660 in attendance.
- Lights On After School- hosted at Boys & Girls Club, in collaboration with Boys and Girls Club and the Springfield Greene County Park Board over 300 kids and families attending to recognize the national need for Quality Before and After School programming

TEENS

- Twelve teens went to the statewide Youth In Government Convention in December. Three of which held leadership positions and two more were chosen to hold office in 2011. In addition, teens in print press and video news won three awards for best hard news story and printed report.
- The YTeens After Hours experience a 9% growth providing a safe and positive place for teens to go after school.
- The Counselors in Training (CIT) program for teens experienced a 64% growth which trained teens going into high school to become counselors for our Summer Odyssey program. Each teen leaves the program with resume building, job interview training, college prep and career planning.

CAMP WAKONDA

- Restructured programming to give more progression as campers grow older including more horse experiences, carnival, and more campers canoeing.
- Added new archery and BB gun ranges.
- New low zip line swing to add to our existing tree house area.
- Over 200 volunteers from local groups provided over 1000 hours of labor to do improvement projects including: painting, deck staining, brush and tree clearing, gravel trails and general clean up of the camp.
- Completed raising funds to construct a new pool and water system for 2011.
- YMCA Corporate board authorized camp to form new leadership board and move forward with a high priority commitment of the YMCA to camp

PAT JONES FAMILY YMCA

- In 2010, the Pat Jones Family YMCA renovated our Indoor Pool and built a New Family Pool with includes many Spray Features for or younger water enthusiasts.
- Pat Jones Family YMCA had 4,258 Units of Membership and 9,991 total members.
- Provided \$434,410 worth of Financial Assistance to 1,340 Youth and Families.
- Provided Free Family Memberships to all Foster Adopt Families in Greene County for the last 7 Years.
- Offered 123 Wellness Classes a week.
- We conducted 1,722 Healthy Lifestyle Appointments for New Members.
- Our Sports Department provided Sports Opportunities to 4,051 in: Soccer, Flag Football, Basketball, Baseball/Softball, Wrestling, Volleyball, and Gymnastics.
- We offered 23 Wellness Classes for Older Adults, both land and water, averaging over 30 participants per class.
- Our Arts Academy provided 1,562 Youth and Adults opportunities to discover Arts including: painting, pottery, drawing, dance, and many others.
- Our YMCA Kids Zone and Jammin' Gym host over 100 children every day in activities at the YMCA.

OZARK MOUNTAIN FAMILY YMCA

Ozark Mountain Family YMCA has made tremendous strides, evidenced by the growing number of people we serve:

MEMBERSHIP & INVOLVEMENT

- Served a membership constituency of more than 2,700 individuals representing 1047 Membership units
- More than 3,500 program participants

CHILD CARE PROGRAMS

- Home School Programs – over 100 participants representing over 50 families
- Before & After school programs – 180 participants
- Child Watch at the Y – 120 participate weekly
- Summer Odyssey – 150 participants

YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS

- Youth Sports – 1,800 participants annually
- Gymnastics – 1,200 participants annually
- Martial Arts – 75 participants monthly

ADULT ACTIVITY PROGRAMS

- Adult Sports – 190 participants annually
- Adult Wellness Classes – 60 participants monthly
- “Silver Sneakers” Seniors Programs – 60 participants monthly

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE & UNDERWRITING

- Ozark Mountain Family YMCA provided over \$93,500 in financial assistance, over 930 individuals to be YMCA members or participate in YMCA programs.

As the Ozark Mountain Family YMCA has grown, the Board of Managers has multiplied its effectiveness through collaborative partnerships with other community organizations serving children and families in the Y’s service area. Working together, contributing our respective strengths, we developed quality recreational and educational programs throughout the area, with the common goal of serving residents of all ages.

COLLABORATIONS

- Branson and Hollister School Districts offering before and after-school child care programs in the districts.
 - Today, the program in Branson is licensed for 120 children and provides before-school child care at three sites.
 - The Hollister school district and YMCA partnership provides after school care for 60 children.
 - In addition, the YMCA supports children involved in the Hollister district’s homeless program by providing them with a hot meal at the end of the day.

- Hollister Parks Department YMCA provides youth programs, planning and supervising all recreation programs formerly operated by the City of Hollister. Parks Department provides maintenance of athletic fields.

- Boys and Girls Club – offering flag and tackle football, gymnastics, and other youth sports programs to Boys and Girls Club participants at YMCA member rate. This partnership allows for expanded services to the community that both organizations serve and utilization of the Y’s facilities.

- Healthy Families Fair – partners with the Healthy Families Task force to provide a fun filled day for approximately 350 adults and children. The event fosters relationships with area organizations, provides parenting and family education, and as gives the kids a day of fun-filled activities.

- Telos Bible Church – delivering facility space availability for church services. The church constructed a loft space in the YMCA for additional Teen programming, as well as a rock climbing wall with instructors.

- Stone and Taney Counties, Division of Family Services – providing free YMCA memberships to foster care families.

- Hollister Chamber of Commerce – providing seasonal festival and special event opportunities for the community, such as the annual Grape Festival in Downtown Hollister and Boo Bash which was attended by more than 1000 people 2009.

- YMCA Healthy lifestyles Program – partnering with area agencies, businesses, and ministries to provide educational and support group opportunities on a regular monthly basis.

- Humana’s “Silver Sneakers” Program – providing wellness classes, social events, and volunteer opportunities tailored to the active older adult.

- College of the Ozarks – offering college level courses in gymnastics and providing YMCA facility access during the NAIA national basketball tournament.

- Faith Community Health – providing client intake for the newly-established health clinic to provide medical services for the working uninsured in Stone and Taney counties. The YMCA will offer membership and preventative health and wellness opportunities for FCH clients. 50% of the clients that registered for FCH chose to become YMCA members.

MONETT / CASSVILLE YMCA

- The YMCA loaned inflatable games, at no charge, for more than 30 community church and other non-profit events during the year.
 - On January 9, 2011, Monett YMCA reached \$10 million goal for capital campaign to build new YMCA at Monett's South Park.
 - Monett Membership grew to over 3,100 individuals for the highest membership ever.
 - Cassville membership grew to over 1,100 individuals for highest membership ever.
 - Over 450 individuals received financial assistance for membership in Monett and Cassville.
 - Special Event Highlights
 - Over 900 participants in Healthy Kids Day with help from local churches and organizations
 - New Cheer program in Monett attracted 64 participants.
 - Cassville started Summer Odyssey, soccer and cheer camps, and Zumba classes
 - Fifth year of Monett Midway Regional Race 5k and 10k
 - Fifth year of Cassville Y-Not-Tri Triathlon
 - Over 3,000 participants in "Trunk or Treat" collaborated with local churches and organizations.
- Friday Family Fun Nights grew to regularly have 100 participants in Cassville and Monett with special activities and contests during the winter

ROY BLUNT YMCA OF BOLIVAR

KEY FOCUS AREA SUCCESSES:

- 2010 was a year of continued growth and advancement for the YMCA, especially in community impact and influence. Below is a highlighted list of just a few of the exciting things that happened.
- New LIVESTRONG at the YMCA Program
 - LIVESTRONG at the YMCA is a partnership between the YMCA and CMH. The Roy Blunt YMCA of Bolivar was selected as one of 10 in the nation to pilot this nationwide Lance Armstrong Foundation program at the YMCA. August marked the first cancer survivorship class to participate in this new program. The impact has been considerable for the participants and their families. This program continues at the YMCA.
- A New Aquatic Center
 - Early December the Board of Alderman voted to approve the placement of a request for a quarter-cent sales tax for local parks and recreation on the April ballot. With a voting approval by voters on April 6th, the sales tax passed and thus is providing funding for construction of an aquatic center in Bolivar to replace the current municipal swimming pool, which is in need of major repair. Money from the sales tax will also be used to operate the city's nine-hole golf course and provide other recreational opportunities.
 - The "Open Air" indoor/outdoor aquatic facility will be a year round structure with a retractable roof system. The aquatic center is designed for two bodies of water. One will be a recreational/family pool with zero depth entry, a current channel, vortex, sprayground, and other a competition/adventure program pool. It is also designed for two giant water slides, climbing wall, lily pad crossing, zip line and more.
 - The new city-owned year-round facility will be attached to the YMCA. The YMCA is contracted by the city to operate the new aquatic center.
- YMCA Membership Growth
 - Membership growth of 238 units and 868 members over the course of the year. Greatest increase was in family membership.
- YMCA Community Healthy Living Index
 - The CHLI is a team of stakeholders who are focused on improving the overall health of the community. Their work is purposed in environmental and policy change in order to decrease or diminish the existing obstacles that prevent people from being active and healthy. One of the key focus areas of this group was to recognize healthy eating establishments. Sponsored by the Polk County Health Center and the YMCA, the "Live Well" program was created. Twenty three restaurants were formally recognized for meeting the healthy menu criteria.

•YMCA "After Hours – Skate Night"

-As a means to increase family programming in the Bolivar area, the YMCA started a family skate night program in October. From fall to spring, nearly every Saturday night after closing the YMCA opens back up as a roller skating rink for YMCA members. The positive music, fun games and activities, a giant inflatable, and the exciting atmosphere has drawn a consistent flow 90 – 165 people to this family event.

PROGRAM AND STAFF:

- Program quality and participant expansion continues to be a high priority. The deliberate work in promoting the Christian Mission in YMCA programs resulted in an increased level of program satisfaction from the participants.
- Brent Good was hired on staff in May as the new Program Director – Sports. Brent's education includes a Bachelor's in Science and a Masters in education.
- Johanna Wood was hired on staff in August. Johanna's education includes a Bachelor in Science and Physical Education and a Masters of Education in Educational Administration.
- Katie Green was hired on staff in September as the new Program Director – Membership and Wellness. Katie's education includes a Bachelor's in Psychology and a Minor in Counseling with an emphasis in Biology.

BOARD & FINANCIAL DEVELOPMENT:

- YMCA Board Development continues to be strong. The branch board continues to be one of the strongest boards in the area. The board is committed to reaching the branch and association objectives outlined in the strategic plan.
- The annual Strong Kids Campaign continued its success this year. Through an enhanced campaign structure coupled with a community volunteer task force, 2010 was a success in nearly reaching the \$60,000 Strong Kids Campaign goal.

COMMUNITY:

- YMCA continues its strong relationships with multiple organizations including, but not limited to Bolivar School District, the City of Bolivar, Citizens Memorial Healthcare, Southwest Baptist University, Polk County Health Center, Juvenile Courts, various service clubs, and more.

DALLAS COUNTY AREA YMCA

KEY FOCUS AREA SUCCESSES:

• 2010 was a year of continued growth and advancement for the YMCA, especially in community impact and influence. Below is a highlighted list of just a few of the exciting things that happened this year.

• YMCA Membership Growth

-Membership growth of 239 units and 512 members over the course of the year. Greatest increase was in family and senior memberships.

-Our capital campaign, although still in progress, has experienced enough success to allow us to purchase a 12 pieces of Cybex strength equipment and 2 pieces of cardio equipment.

• Wellness Classes

-To serve our members better we have grown from just 3 group exercise classes to 14 classes including: Yoga, Zumba, and Cardio Kickboxing

• New Prime Time Afterschool Program

-The Dallas County Area YMCA is the largest partner with the Dallas County R1 school district's 21st Century Grant. Through this grant the YMCA serves Dallas County's 2 elementary schools by providing a high quality low cost afterschool program for just \$2 a day.

-In August the YMCA began offering a Holiday Adventure program to serve our community's youth when school is out.

-In August the YMCA began offering a tumbling program as part the afterschool program. We instantly had 30+ kids enroll to be a part of this program.

-As a means to increase family programming in the Buffalo area, the YMCA started a family fun nights in June. From June to December, almost ½ the Friday nights the YMCA opens back up to offer free youth programs to YMCA members and for a small fee to nonmembers. These programs allow both youth and parents to have a night out on their own. Music, fun games and activities, a giant inflatable, and the exciting atmosphere have drawn consistent attendance numbers.

• YMCA "Workout before Porkout"

-Our 2nd annual Thanksgiving Day morning programming experienced continued success and growth. In just its second year we had nearly 70 community member participate in our 5k run/ walk, packed group cycling classes, and open gym.

• Program quality and participant expansion continues to be a high priority. The deliberate work in promoting the Christian Mission in YMCA programs resulted in an increased level of program satisfaction from the participants.

•Michelle Bell was hired on staff in December as the new Program Director. Michelle has been a part of Dallas County for a long time and instantly put her skills to work building new programs all while expanding current ones. Michelle's education includes a Masters in Business Administration.

The Lebanon YMCA began operation in the Cowan Civic Center on January 4th, and has seen significant growth in Membership as well as program offerings to benefit Lebanon and Laclede County.

The Y has been received well, growing to over 700 units, equaling over 2000 Members in its first year.

The Volunteer Board of Directors well exceeded their first campaign goal by successfully raising \$36,000 to ensure that everyone in the community has the opportunity of participation in Y programs.

•Kids Night Out, monthly fun-filled evening for kids, averaging 30 kids each month.

•Home School Interaction and Art, partnership with the Lebanon Home School Association, 132 school-aged kids participate once a week in fun, active and creative program.

• Youth Baseball, the Y accepted operation of the Optimist's Baseball League and was able to run successfully with 140 Kids in that program. In addition, we held a follow-up League, with 6 teams participating.

• Adult League Sports, serving over 250 adults with Basketball, Flag Football, Volleyball and Drama Camp, in partnership with the Lebanon High School Drama Department, the Y held a Drama Camp for kids on the Cowan Civic Center's theatre stage, with 75 participants.

• Swimming Lessons, we taught over 300 kids to swim (April-December), also training and recertifying 11 lifeguards for the area

• Swim Club, the Stingrays Swim Club had 47 Youth & Adults who competed in seven swim meet throughout the area.

• Wellness, by offering 29 land/aquatics classes and specialty programs a week, we averaged 180 participants weekly

• Kids Zone, a space was established for the Y Kids Zone Staff to care for over 100 children weekly, while parents are participating in Y programs.

• Boswell Aquatic Center, the Y accepted operational duties of Lebanon's outdoor Aquatic Center featuring a kiddie pool, two slides, diving well, floating characters and a cargo net/ lily pad obstacle.
